PARENT OR GUARDIAN

The purpose of this grade card is to indicate to you as clearly as possible the conduct and class standing of the pupil.

The students divide themselves into five groups:

- M (MEDIUM) Means that the work is of the middle grade.
S (SUPERIOR) Means that better work than medium is being done.
E (EXCELLENT) Means that the pupil belongs to a small group of those who are doing work of the highest grade.
I (INFERIOR) Means that the work is below medium or lower than the majority of the pupils in that subject, and is unsatisfactory.
F (FAILURE) Means that the student is failing to make a passing grade.

Note carefully the rank of your child and if it is low try to find a reason in lack of application and home study.
