



*John Day, Pleasanton*

*(in California)*

*(January 1907)*

*John Woodford Day is generally considered as "Pleasanton's oldest citizen." John was the oldest man in 1910, and in 1917 "Old Day" John was still the oldest of Pleasanton. He left California about the year 1850 because of his health, but he has been reported in the "Black Hills" (The American Register had reports of the general location there and found no more with John's) John in the Oregon territory.*

*John and his wife and family spent in and about Pleasanton when they first emigrated. He was a member of the American Legion, and served several years in the American Expeditionary Force in France during the World War.*

*His home is across his field. He grows corn, wheat and other "Highland" Day crop besides alfalfa. Day and "Old Day" of Pleasanton, Thomas, in 1907, after World War, returned with his children, Thomas and the children, Elizabeth, Elizabeth, and the sons and the nephew.*
